DAME FANNY FOLLICLE – A larger than life Dame. Runs the local salon. PRINCE RYDER – A Prince from a far off land on a quest.



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FAIRY: Fairy Dandruff! We'll stop you – make no mistake!


GOTHEL: *'Fairy Dandruff', ey? Well, aren't you a flake!*
